Between the first and second readings the choir sings **The Benedictus:**

Blessed be the Lord God of Israel: for he hath visited, and redeemed his people; And hath raised up a mighty salvation for us: in the house of his servant David; As he spoke by the mouth of his holy Prophets: which have been since the world began; That we should be saved from our enemies: and from the hands of all that hate us; To perform the mercy promised to our forefathers: and to remember his holy Covenant; To perform the oath which he sware to our forefather Abraham: that he would give us; That we being delivered out of the hands of our enemies: might serve him without fear; In holiness and righteousness before him: all the days of our life.

And thou, Child, shalt be called the Prophet of the Highest:

for thou shalt go before the face of the Lord to prepare his ways;

To give knowledge of salvation unto his people: for the remission of their sins,

Through the tender mercy of our God:

whereby the day-spring from on high hath visited us;

To give light to them that sit in darkness, and in the shadow of death: and to guide our feet into the way of peace.

The "Benedictus" is one of the three canticles in the opening chapters of St. Luke's Gospel, the other two being the "Magnificat" and the "Nunc dimittis". The "Benedictus" was the song of thanksgiving uttered by Zechariah on the occasion of the circumcision of his son, John the Baptist.

During communion the choir sings "Rejoice in the Lord always" by John Redford

Rejoice in the Lord alway: and again I say, Rejoice.

Let your softness be known unto all men. The Lord is at hand.

Be careful for nothing; but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto
