We would like to thank Maureen Voyce and Liz Rose and their band of helpers for the work that they put into the preparation of the Christingle kits last week. **The retiring collection raised £336.22, including Gift Aid, for The Children's Society;** thank you for your generosity.

Like many churches, St Michael's and St Mary's keep the season of Lent as a time of reflection and penitence. This year, Bishop Alan's book, **Saints and Pilgrims in the Diocese of St Albans** will be used by the Lent Groups. We have been able to acquire copies of this high quality book at a heavily discounted rate of £10 per copy. They will be **available to purchase after the 9.30 a.m. service today, or from Bronwen Parr on bronwenparr@hotmail.com or (01727) 864645.** Some may want to use these books for private study while others may want to come and discuss the excerpts in one of our two Lent Groups - a daytime group in the vicarage after the Wednesday 10 a.m. service, or an evening group in the Parish Centre on Tuesdays 8–9.30 p.m.

Do you live in the parish or regularly worship at St Michael's or St Mary's and are over 16? If so, do join the **Electoral Roll**. The Church Electoral Roll gives you voting rights at parish meetings. Please pick up a form from the back of either church.

Gradually, over many years, most of St Michael's communications have shifted from paper to electronic format. This has rendered the **pigeon holes** at the back of the Lady Chapel largely redundant for church purposes. Therefore, following John Hayton's First Law of Spirituality – "Less is More" - **the pigeon holes are due for retirement after the February half term.** If you may have any stray items left in your pigeon hole, please check and remove. **Stewards and Church Guides,** please note that the box of badges will move into the choir vestry in a few weeks' time.

It has come to our attention that part of **St Michael's churchyard wall** facing Bluehouse Hill is in a dangerous condition. Please be careful if walking in the vicinity. St Michael's churchyard is closed to new burials. This means that responsibility for arranging repairs to this wall and associated permissions rests with St Albans District Council. The PCC is waiting to hear how SADC proposes to address this issue.
