Psalm 27 The Lord is my light and my salvation

Psalm 46 Be still, and know that I am God

Psalm 91 He shall cover you with his wings

Psalm 139 O Lord, you have searched me out and known me

Isaiah 43, verses 1-7. Do not fear, for I am with you

Luke 12, verses 22-31. Do not worry

John 14, verses 1-6. Do not let your hearts be troubled

Ephesians 2, verses 19-22. You are citizens with the saints

Romans 9, verses 9-12. Rejoicing, patience and perseverance

The Benedictus (The Song of Zechariah)

Blessed be the Lord the God of Israel, who has come to his people and set them free. He has raised up for us a mighty Saviour, born of the house of his servant David. With our fellow Christians help us to be people of courage; as we pray for ourselves, may we be people who protect our neighbours and the safety of all those around us.

Lord, we are not people of greed: we are people of generosity. Help us to be your people God, giving and loving, wherever we are, giving us strength wherever you call us. **Amen.**
