#### Welcome

Welcome to St Michaels and St Marys: two Christian communities, part of the Church of England. For more information about what we do, please take a welcome leaflet or search our website.

You have come to a service of Holy Communion: we hear God's Word through the Bible, and share Jesus' presence in bread and wine. Christians from different traditions worship here and we do our best to meet a breadth of need.

Along with a blue hymn book found in each pew, this booklet contains much of what you will need for today's service. We say the **bold type** words together. Words in *italics* offer practical information for example about when to stand or sit. Words in boxes explain the reason for what we do and say.

Singing is an important part of worship. In addition to the hymns, music for the parts of the service (the 'setting') is printed in this booklet. The setting in this booklet includes music by John Bell and Richard Bond.

Sit where you feel most comfortable. Apart from a few seats for people with specific jobs, no spaces are reserved.

If you have children with you, the back of the north aisle and adjacent tower room contain toys and books. During term time, children's groups run in the Parish Centre and nearby school.

Toilets and baby change facilities are available. Please see a steward for access.

If you have a hearing amplification device, use setting 'T'; the strongest signal is in the main body of the church forward from the entrance door.

#### **Eastertide**

Easter is the happiest time of the Christian year! Jesus has been raised from the dead and shares his eternal life with all believers. The colours of the season are celebratory white and gold.

On Easter Day many churches rededicate their paschal candle, a reminder of Christ's light among us. Since the time of the early Church, Easter has also been the traditional season for adult Baptisms: candidates who have undertaken preparation during Lent celebrate their faith during the great vigil service on Easter Eve, recalling the story of the Passover, how God saved the Jewish people through the waters of the Red Sea.

The name 'Easter' actually derives from a pagan festival which was kept at this time of year before the Anglo-Saxons were converted to Christianity in the seventh century. In non-Germanic languages the festival name is more appropriately rooted in the Jewish 'Passover' / 'Pesach' - e.g. Welsh 'Pasg' or French 'Pâques'.

Easter Day is calculated as the first Sunday after the first full moon after the spring equinox. The season culminates on Ascension Day, when, after forty days, Jesus returned to his Father in heaven. Following the Ascension, the disciples went back to Jerusalem to wait for the coming of God's Spirit; this happened at 'Pentecost' – literally 'fifty days' after Easter.

Happy Easter: may Christ meet you in the power of his risen presence!



# Before we begin

# The Gathering (Easter Day only)

#### We stand for

#### The Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. The creed is a summary of Christian belief from the Early Church

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.
On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come.


'Eucharist' means 'thanksgiving' in

Greek. This part of our service commemorates Jesus' giving thanks

to the Father at the Last Supper, and also thanks God for everything

that he does for us through Jesus.

Father, you made the world and love your creation. You gave your Son Jesus Christ to be our Saviour. His dying and rising have set us free from sin and death. And so we gladly thank you, with saints and angels praising you, and singing:



We praise and bless you, loving Father, through Jesus Christ, our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us the body and blood of your dear Son.

On the night before he died he had supper with his friends and, taking bread, he praised you. He broke the bread, gave it to them and said: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine. Again he praised you, gave it to them and said: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross.

Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

Dying you destroyed our death, rising you restored our life: Lord Jesus, come in glory. Lord of all life,
help us to work together for that day
when your kingdom comes
and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth.
Look with favour on your people,
gather us in your loving arms
and bring us with all the saints
to feast at your table in heaven.

Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever.

Amen.

# Appendix I: Baptism

#### At the beginning

The president may use these or other introductory words:

Our Lord Jesus Christ has told us that to enter the kingdom of heaven we must be born again of water and the Spirit, and has given us baptism as the sign and seal of this new birth. Here we are washed by the Holy Spirit and made clean. Here we are clothed with Christ, dying to sin that we may live his risen life. As children of God, we have a new dignity and God calls us to fullness of life.

#### At the Collect

The president may use these or other introductory words:

Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, from whose wounded side flowed life for the world: raise your people from sin and death and build them as living stones into the spiritual temple of your Church; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, world without end.

Amen.

#### Presentation of the Candidates

At the end of the sermon we stand and face the font

The president addresses the whole congregation

God raised Jesus Christ from the dead and sent the Holy Spirit to recall the whole world to himself. In baptism we die to sin and rise to newness of life in Christ. Here we find rebirth in the Spirit, and set our minds on his heavenly gifts. As children of God, we are continually created anew, as we walk the path of faith, and feed on the forgiveness of his healing grace.

Faith is the gift of God to his people. In baptism the Lord is adding to our number those whom he is calling. People of God, will you welcome *N* (and *M*...) and uphold them in their new life in Christ?

#### With the help of God, we will.

Parents and godparents, the Church receives these children with joy. Today we are trusting God for their growth in faith. Will you pray for them, draw them by your example into the community of faith and walk with them in the way of Christ?

Parents and godparents: With the help of God, we will.

In baptism these children begin their journey in faith. You speak for them today. Will you care for them, and help them to take their place within the life and worship of Christ's Church?

Parents and godparents: With the help of God, we will.

#### The Decision

Baptism involves a two-way movement, away from sin and towards God - seen here and in the creed on the next page

The president addresses the congregation

In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light.
To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him.

Therefore I ask:

Do you reject the devil and all rebellion against God? I reject them.

Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil? **I renounce them.** 

Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbour?

I repent of them.

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?

I turn to Christ.

Do you submit to Christ as Lord?

I submit to Christ.

Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth and the life?

I come to Christ.

#### **Profession of Faith**

At Easter Christians are encouraged to renew the vows made at their baptism. And so, brothers and sisters, I ask you to profess together with these candidates the faith of the Church.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe and trust in his Son Jesus Christ?

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit,
the holy catholic Church,
the communion of saints,
the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body,
and the life everlasting.
Amen.

# Prayer over the Water

Praise God who made heaven and earth, who keeps his promise for ever.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

Almighty God, whose Son Jesus Christ was baptized in the river Jordan, we thank you for the gift of water to cleanse us and revive us. We thank you that through the waters of the Red Sea you led your people out of slavery to freedom in the Promised Land. We thank you that through the deep waters of death you brought your Son, and raised him to life in triumph. Bless this water, that your servants who are washed in it may be made one with Christ in his death and in his resurrection, to be cleansed and delivered from all sin. Send your Holy Spirit upon them, bring them to new birth in the household of faith and raise them with Christ to full and eternal life; for all might, majesty, authority and power are yours, now and for ever.

Amen.

#### **Baptism**

N, I baptise you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Amen.

You have been clothed with Christ.
As many as are baptised into Christ have put on Christ.

#### Signing with the Cross

The president makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of each candidate, saying

Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of his cross.

When all the candidates have been signed

Do not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified. Fight valiantly as a disciple of Christ against sin, the world and the devil, and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.

May God, who has received you by baptism into his Church, pour upon you the riches of his grace, that within the company of Christ's pilgrim people you may daily be renewed by his anointing Spirit, and come to the inheritance of the saints in glory. **Amen.** 

#### The Welcome

There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism: by one Spirit we are all baptised into one body. We welcome you into the fellowship of faith; we are children of the same heavenly Father; we welcome you.

# Giving of a Lighted Candle
