Old Testament Reading: Nehemiah 8: 1-3, 5-6, 8-10 (OT p.407 in the Pew Bibles)

The choir will sing words from Psalm 19

The heavens declare the glory of God: and the firmament sheweth his handywork. One day telleth another: and one night certifieth another.

There is neither speech nor language: but their voices are heard among them.

Their sound is gone out into all lands: and their words into the ends of the world. In them hath he set a tabernacle for the sun:

which cometh forth as a bridegroom out of his chamber,

and rejoiceth as a giant to run his course.

It goeth forth from the uttermost part of the heaven,

and runneth about unto the end of it again :

and there is nothing hid from the heat thereof.

New Testament Reading: I Corinthians 12: 12-31a (NT p.161 in the Pew Bibles)

Gospel Reading:

Jesus, filled with the power of the Spirit, returned to Galilee, and a report about him spread through all the surrounding country. He began to teach in their synagogues and was praised by everyone.

When he came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, he went to the synagogue on the sabbath day, as was his custom. He stood up to read, and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was given to him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written:

'The Spirit of the Lord is upon me,

because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor.

He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives

and recovery of sight to the blind,

to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour.'

And he rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant, and sat down. The eyes of all in the synagogue were fixed on him. Then he began to say to them, 'Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing.'

LENT

Like many churches, St Michael's and St Mary's will keep the season of Lent as a time of reflection and repentance. This year we are encouraging you to dig deeper into the things of God through *The Little Book of Lent* (ed. Arthur Howells), a compilation of readings for each day of the season written by famous twentieth- and twenty-first-century Christians. We will be exploring these passages in *Lent Groups*. There will be:

- an evening group running on Zoom, five Tuesdays from March 8th to April 5th, 8–9.30pm. Zoom code to be circulated nearer the time.
