New Testament Reading:

As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. Like many churches, St Michael's and St Mary's is keeping the **season of Lent** as a time of reflection and repentance. This year we are encouraging you to dig deeper into the things of God through *The Little Book of Lent* (ed. Arthur Howells), a compilation of readings for each day of the season written by famous twentieth- and twenty-first-century Christians. We are exploring these passages in *Lent Groups*:
