New Testament Reading: Acts 1: 6-11

So when Jesus and the disciples had come together, they asked him, 'Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?' But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.'

Father, I desire that those also, whom you have given me, may be with me where I am, to see my glory, which you have given me because you loved me before the foundation of the world.
